Sub: Joint guidelines on selection of SHGs for provisioning of Government business under CAMPA under FE & CC Department

Madam/Sir,

Self-Help Groups under Mission Shakti undertake a wide range of economic activities and generate substantial incomes, enabling financial stability and empowerment of lakhs of women in the State. The forestry sector holds tremendous prospects for SHGs to take up income generating activities including Decentralized Semi-Permanent Nursery (SHG CAMPA Nursery), Production & Supply of Vermicompost, Production & Supply of Farm Yard Manure / Cow Dung Manure, Forest Fire Awareness and micro planning & capacity building under Ama Jangal Yojana (AJY). Accordingly, various identified forestry sector activities are being rolled out by the FE & CC Department in coordination with the Mission Shakti Department, which aims to cover around 10,470 SHGs per annum over the next 3 years.

The activities which are being rolled out by the Forest, Environment & Climate Change Department during the FY 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24 are detailed at **Annexure-I**. Number of SHGs targeted against each activity is only minimal and notional and more number of SHGs can be linked to these activities, basing on feasibility and progress of collaboration

Hence, it is of utmost importance that the field functionaries of the Department of Mission Shakti identify the suitable SHGs for various activities and sponsor their list to the Divisional Forest Officers (DFOs) of the FE & CC Department, so that these projects can be grounded. Following criteria and process may be ensured for selection of SHGs.

Allocation of block wise target

 The DFO in consultation with the PD, DRDA and DSWO will allocate the block wise targets under each forestry scheme basing on the number of SHGs and feasibility of implementation of projects in concerned blocks.

Process for selection of SHGs

The selection of SHGs will be for the following activities under forestry sector

- a. Decentralized Semi-Permanent Nursery (SHG CAMPA Nursery)
- b. Production & Supply of Vermicompost
- c. Production & Supply of Farm Yard Manure / Cow Dung Manure
- d. Forest Fire Awareness
- e. Micro planning & capacity building under Ama Jangal Yojana (AJY)
- The Block Development Officer (BDO) and CDPO along with Forest Range Officers (FROs) shall give wide publicity and awareness among the SHGs on various schemes & its benefits. Mission Shakti field functionaries will facilitate awareness among the SHGs in coordination with the field functionaries of FE & CC Department.
- Expressions of Interest (EoI) for engagement of SHGs under forestry sector schemes shall be invited by the DSWO basing on the block / range wise target & scheme details to be communicated by the concerned DFO. Copy of EoI will be also be communicated to the DFO.
- The EoI shall be published at the offices of the DFOs, DSWO, CDPOs, BDOs, FROs, AWCs and BLF for a period of 15 days. The format for Expression of Interest for SHGs is enclosed herewith as **Annexure II**.
- Block Level Selection Committee: The Block Level Selection Committee comprising of following officials is formed to examine the received Expressions of Interests of SHGs and select the eligible SHGs following the SHG Selection Criteria. The format is annexed as Annexure III.
 - i. Block Development Officer (BDO) Chairperson
 - ii. Child Development Project Officer (CDPO) Member Convener
 - iii. Forest Range Officer/s (FRO) Member/s
 - iv. Block Project Coordinator & Block Project Manager, Mission Shakti Members
- 5. A. Common Criteria for identification and selection of SHGs / SHG

Federations:

- SHGs for these proposed interventions include SHG Federations.
- ii. SHG must have completed one year from the date of formation.

- SHG should belong to the same block where they propose to take up the activity.
- iv. SHG must have an active Bank account.
- v. SHG must not be a bank loan defaulter.
- vi. SHG must have undertaken regular and systematic book keeping including maintenance of meeting register, cash book, updated pass book among others.

B. Specific Criteria for Particular Activities

- Decentralized Semi-Permanent Nursery (SHG CAMPA Nursery): SHGs having experience in nursery / plantation / any other forestry activities may be given preference from among the applicant SHGs / Federations.
- ii. Production & Supply of Vermi-compost: The applicant SHGs should have adequate space of about 20 meter x 15 meter for establishment of vermi-compost unit and availability of sufficient cow dung / compost. Further preference will be given to those SHGs which are interested to construct temporary shade as per the requirement.
- iii. Production & Supply of Farm Yard Manure / Cow Dung Manure: The applicant SHGs should have sizable cattle population or should have access to collect cow dung from nearby sources. Each SHG member should have open space of 3 m x 3 m for formation of compost pits as required.
- iv. Forest Fire Awareness: The SHG should belong to forest fringe locality where intensity of forest fire is more. Preference will be given to SHGs earlier associated with other Government awareness programmes.
- v. Micro planning & capacity building under Ama Jangal Yojana (AJY): The SHG should belong to AJY VSS village where micro planning is under process. Preference will be given to the SHG having experience in arranging similar activities.

The Committee will scrutinize the EoIs based on the SHG Selection Criteria and select the empanelled list of SHGs considering the targets.

- 6. Block Level Inspection Teams: The Block Level Inspection Teams are formed consisting of the following members to undertake a joint verification of the proposed shortlisted SHGs for engagement under activities such as Decentralised Semi-Permanent Nursery, Production & Supply of Vermicompost and Production & Supply of Farm Yard Manure / Cow Dung Manure.
 - i. Forest Range Officer (Concerned FRO) Chairperson
 - ii. Foresters Members
 - iii. BPC & BPM, Mission Shakti Members

- 7. The Block Level Inspection Team will interact with the shortlisted SHGs for ascertaining the willingness & ability to take up the activity with a spot visit. The team shall submit a feasibility report to the Convener, Block Level Selection Committee. The format of the report is annexed as **Annexure IV**.
- 8. The Block Level Selection Committee shall examine the Field Inspection Report and select suitable SHGs as per criteria. Activity wise authenticated empaneled list of SHGs shall be prepared by the BLSC. The Convener of the Committee cum CDPO shall share the empaneled list of selected SHGs with the block & district level officials of FE & CC Department for issue of Approval Letter / Work Order to the SHGs. The activity wise Approval Letter / Work Order shall be issued as per the panel list. A copy should also be submitted to the DFO, DSWO, PD, DRDA & Collector of the district for information and review of progress.
- After issue of the Approval Letter / Work Order, the SHG will take up the activity and other infrastructure as the case may be under direct supervision and guidance of the Forest Guard/ Forester / Forest Range Officer.
- 10. Training and Capacity Building: The BDO, with assistance of FRO and field functionaries of Mission Shakti shall organize activity wise training programme for the selected SHGs. Resource persons to impart training shall be selected from among the block/ district level officers of the technical departments.
- 11. Training will be organized by the FRO at the range level or any other convenient place involving selected SHGs. Each SHG will be trained on the recommended management practices of the proposed activity.
- 12. SHG team Leader will report the progress of activities fortnightly to the Forest Guard/ Forester concerned based on which the FG/Forester will submit fortnightly report to Forest Range Officer after inspection of the Worksite.
- 13. Funds will be released in phased manner depending upon the progress of work as recommended by the forester in his/her inspection report.
- 14. MIS & Documentation: The MIS & documentation of activities taken up under this convergence programme shall be made by the FRO as per the prescribed format.

The detailed guidelines of each scheme will be communicated separately by the concerned DFO of FE & CC Department. It is requested that the matter regarding the selection of suitable SHGs, issue of Approval letter / Work Order to the SHGs, may be periodically reviewed with PD, DRDA, DFO and DSWO.
